Hi Everyone,

Sorry to be getting this out so late. Here are the forms we discussed last week. Note there is a Power of Attorney Form as well as a Durable Power of Attorney Form. Jacqui asked a great question about the first form, which led to a discussion between the two.

The following is from the TARCOG paperwork that the lawyer gave out at the Moon Lake Library talk:

- A **Power of Attorney** gives your chose person/agent the authority to act for you in specified or all legal or financial matters. A Power of Attorney is a legal document that allows a principal (you) to appoint an agent (your chose person) to act for you should you become incapacitated.
- A **Non-durable** Power of Attorney ends once the principle (you) becomes incompetent or incapacitated.
- A **Durable Power of Attorney** is one that survives incompetency. That means the power of attorney is still good and the agent's power s are still in effect even if the person who made the Power of Attorney becomes incompetent or incapacitated.
- All **Powers of Attorney**, both durable and non-durable, end once the agent has knowledge of the principle's death.

At that point the executor of your will will take over.

I recommend having an attorney look over all your documents once they have been completed. Here's the link for free legal advice in Cherokee County:

Also attached is a sample of the long form for Death Certificate Completion. Barbara Lieu has asked that you please add the following information, which is essential for Death Certificates, on the last page of your Medical Form:

- Legal Name
- Served in Armed Forces
- Date of Birth
- Birthplace
- Social Security Number
- Father/Parent Name
- Mother/Parent Name Prior to First Marriage
